

Title: Midnight Miracles

Text: Acts 16:25-34

Target: God specializes in doing miracles when it feels like time has run out.

1. **Song in the _____:** *“About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them,”* (Vs. 25)
 - a. **Worship over Worry:** *“praying and singing hymns”*
 - b. **Worship became a Witness:** *“prisoners were listening to them”*
2. **Shaking of the _____:** *“and suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken. And immediately all the doors were opened, and everyone’s bonds were unfastened.”* (Vs. 26)
 - a. **Foundations:** *“shaken”*
 - b. **Doors:** *“opened”*
 - c. **Bonds:** *“unfastened”*
3. **Stopped by a _____:** *“But Paul cried with a loud voice, “Do not harm yourself, for we are all here.”* (Vs. 28)
 - a. **Voice of Concern:** *“cried with a loud voice”*
 - b. **Voice of Compassion:** *“Don’t harm yourself”*
4. **Seeking of _____:** *“Then he brought them out and said, “Sirs, what must I do to be saved?”* (Vs. 30)
 - a. **Plan of Salvation:** *“And they said, “Believe in the Lord Jesus,”* (Vs. 31b)
 - b. **Promise of Salvation:** *“you will be saved, you and your household.”* (Vs. 31b)
 - c. **Picture of Salvation:** *“And he took them the same hour of the night and washed their wounds; and he was baptized at once, he and all his family.”* (Vs. 33)

Takeaway: When you hit midnight, don’t panic. God does His best writing in the dark.
